# Former QA Teacher Establishes Heffelfinger Scholarship

In the fall of 1946 a seasoned history teacher, Charles Heffelfinger, returned from four years WWII service in the Navy to resume his teaching

career at Queen Anne. That same year a freshfaced young graduate of the University of Washington, Jay Taylor, arrived at Queen Anne to teach industrial arts. The two became good friends and this year, some 57 years later, Jay Taylor and his wife Maurine have established the C.H. Heffelfinger **Scholarship** with a \$2,000 donation to the Queen Anne Scholarship Fund.

Charles H. Heffelfinger grew up in Iowa, attended the University of Des Moines in Iowa and taught school in Iowa and Idaho before completing his BA degree from Whitworth University in Spokane in 1932. He earned his MA from the Univerfall of 1936. In 1941 he authored a textbook, "The teacher of history, especially U.S. History. Evergreen Citizen, a Textbook on the Government of the State of Washington," that was used frequent entrants in the Hearst History Contest, throughout the state. Heffelfinger left Queen Anne

in 1942 for Navy service, first as an instructor at Moffett Field, CA. and later in Honolulu. He remained a commander in the Naval Reserve on his return to civilian life. He was named head of the Social Studies Department at Queen Anne and served there another 14 years until his death from a heart attack at his home in Magnolia May 6, 1960.

Jay Taylor also came from the Midwest, where he attended the State Teachers College in Harney, NE.

One of his professors suggested he move to Seattle for the climate. He did so, and completed his BA at the UW where he met his wife Maurine. She became a teacher at Shorewood.

Taylor spent his entire 27-year teaching career at Queen Anne, leaving in 1973. After two years in the central administration office he retired in 1975.



2004 QAHSAA scholarship applications must be postmarked no later than Wednesday, March 31, 2004. Do not send them via FEDEX or similar carriers. <u>No packets will</u> be mailed to requestors after Monday, March 15, 2004.

Scholarship applications are now available and should immediately be requested by phone (206) 523-0079, or by writing to:

Requestors will receive an instructional cover letter, application form and personal reference forms. Applicants' submittals must include **all items** requested in the cover letter and the application form. <u>Failure to comply with these stipulations may disqualify applicants from consideration.</u>

Applicants are urged to submit their applications as quickly as possible following receipt of their application packets. Don't procrastinate! The sooner the application is received by the committee, the more time the members have to review the application.

Scholarship winners will be selected in early May and the winners will be announced at their schools' honors assemblies or commencement ceremonies.

The alumni scholarship program has been the primary public expression of our Association's legacy since its founding in 1981. The scholarship funds come from the donations of our Grizzly alumni, either individually or through their reunion committees. All donations are tax deductible. # QAHS War Casualties: Alumni Website Looking For Info & Photos

Seventy-six Queen Anne alumni who died in WWII and 15 who died in Viet Nam have been memorialized on the QAHSAA website. Probably many more died in WWII but we need help in completing the memorial. Working from a list of 2,403 QA service-persons compiled before the end of the war, we have been able to find in old yearbooks 55 of the 76 Grizzlies on the Gold Star list. We were unable to find 21 of those who had died in the war by the time the list was compiled. In addition, there were at the time eight listed as missing in action and 11 who were thought to be POWs. We hope that we may get more information from alumni so that all of those who died in WWII will be memorialized.

Fifteen QAHS alumni who died in Viet Nam are also memorialized, and all but two of them are pictured. We have been informed of a 16<sup>th</sup>, Wayne Pettersen '61, and seek more information about him.

The 21 WWII Gold Star alumni who we can't find in yearbooks nor our alumni database are: Leo Bateman, Bruce Brown, James Cleary, William Dikeman, John Gorman, Laverne Hanson, Robert Holland, Ed Howe, Fay Johnson, Willie McLaughlin, Dervyn Muth, Frank Olmsted, Thomas O'Meara, Ray Partee, Fred Picinich, Hoyt Ross, Stanley Taylor, Paul Wendelin, Robert White, Howard Wilson, and Richard Yarrow.

# Jerry Munro – Still Green After All These Years

Garden design has been Gerald (Jerry) Munro's ('35) life-long passion. His shop, Munro's Nursery in Kenmore, is still an active center of Northwest garden and pond designs. The July/August 2003 edition of "Garden Design" magazine featured Jerry's work in an article on a huge garden in a private home near his nursery. The garden included waterfalls, a brook and a koi pond, all designed by Jerry.

He started out selling cut flowers for \$2-\$5 a day at a nursery in Rose Hill (Redmond). A degree in plant genetics at Washington State College led him to a full-time career in land-scaping. Among his projects was the Century

21 World's Fair landscaping along Mercer Street.

Back in high school at Queen Anne, he was a halfback on the football team in the days of leather helmets and a cloud of dust at Civic Stadium. He also remembers setting off a chemi-

Baker's chemistry class. W.O. Baker was a WWI vet and the explosion produced a highly agitated reaction in him. Jerry's favorite teacher was Miss Nada Overland, who taught English and Literature at Queen Anne from 1927-47. Munro would engage her in chess matches.

Jerry graduated from Warren Avenue school before attending QAHS. As a boy he remembers taking streetcars to Green Lake on snowy days and hitching sled rides on the back end of cars. Today, he notes, there is less snow and his nursery increasingly carries California warmweather plants.
