30 Scholarships Awarded

Our 29th annual scholarship competition resulted in 30 scholarship awards made possible by the exceptional generosity of classes, reunion groups, individual donations and the collective donations of many Queen Anne alumni.

This year, 98 application forms were requested, with 74 applications received by the March 31 deadline. This year, 17 scholarships were awarded to high school seniors and 13 to college students.

Those interested in competing for a 2012 award should download an application from the QA website next fall and take great care to follow the completion instructions. High school applicants must submit official transcripts from their school's registrar which must contain their fall semester grades. Post high school applicants must submit their high school, community college and most recent college transcripts. Anything less than an official transcript will disqualify the applicant from competition.

Old John Hay Gets New Life

Queen Anne alums who attended the old John Hay Elementary School at 4th Ave. N. and Boston St are hearing some good news and some bad news.

The good news is that the old school will once again be an elementary school on Queen Anne. The bad news is that the name has been changed to Queen Anne Elementary School.

The original Hay school, which opened in 1905, was closed in 1989 when a new John Hay opened on Luther Field across from Queen Anne High School. Since that time the original Hay school has been used for several special programs. In the past two years the Seattle School District has finally admitted it needs more classrooms and is reopening the old school, with a new name. The old Hay site is a Seattle Landmark and thus both buildings will be preserved.

For the 2010-11 school year the new students have been housed at Lincoln High School. Lincoln has been in continuous use as a back-up site for Seattle schools under reconstruction since it closed in 1981, along with our school.

The new school, which has had major upgrading, will keep the John Hay name now engraved on the exterior, but it will have new signs put up with the new name. The program at Queen Anne Elementary, which will be open to children from the entire district, has a technology focus.

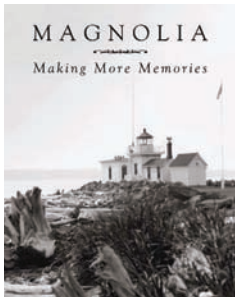

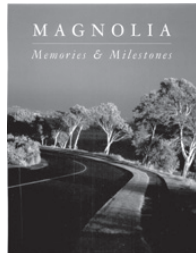
