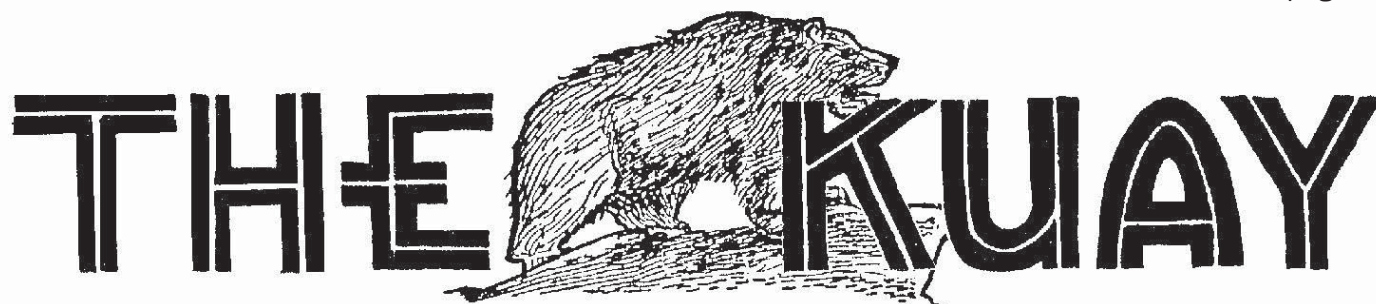

QA Scholarship Rules Change!

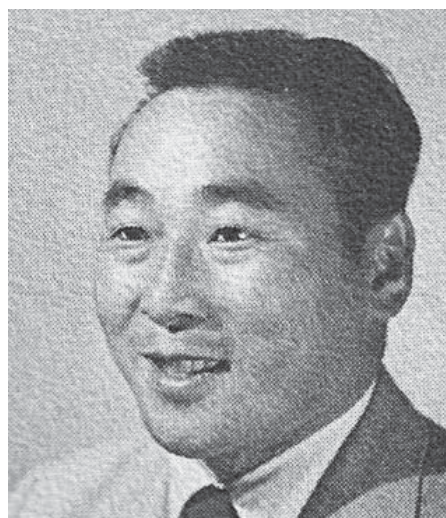

The QA Alumni Board and the Alumni Association Scholarship Committee, chaired by **Kerry McMahan '54**, have chosen to return to the original idea of a scholarship program primarily for high school students and undergraduate college students. We want to include as many different students as possible by not allowing repeats.

To achieve this, the Alumni Board has approved the **following changes** for the scholarship program:

1. You can only win once.
Scholarship recipients cannot reapply.
2. Applicants must be high school seniors or high school equivalency (e.g. GED), college undergrads or former students seeking post-high school education.
3. QA Scholarships can be used only for college undergraduate programs or trade and vocational programs and may not be used for post-graduate programs.

These changes will take effect for **next year's (2017) applicants**. We hope that this will broaden the program to serve the most people. If you have questions about these changes, please contact the Scholarship Chair, Kerry McMahan at scholarships@qagrizzlies.org or at 206-523-0079.

When my class had its fabulous 50th last summer some of the many memories of our years at QAHS recalled our amazing teachers. Some were funny, but most expressed gratitude for the way they made the subjects being taught meaningful or for their impact, never forgotten and used in our later lives.

One teacher in particular, **Chris Kato**, was so acknowledged by a letter the QAHS Alumni Assn. received from **Gary ("Duke") Williams '64**. Mr. Kato taught Chemistry at QAHS from the fall of 1958 to the spring of 1970.

Gary reminded us that Mr. Kato was in the Minidoka Relocation Center (an internment camp in Hunt, ID) during WWII. Mr. Kato graduated from the camp high school, Hunt High. Along with getting his degree in Engineering from Bethel College and the UW, he earned his Master's degree in Chemistry from Oregon State and his Administrator credentials from Seattle U.

Mr. Kato also did judo for 60 years and taught judo for 43 years. He won a National Judo Championship in 1957 and earned a 7th degree black belt.

The recent request for updates to the email listings came back rich with content. Come on, check it out. It doesn't cost anything to look, except time, and for what else are you hoarding time? That being said, here's the new group of newsmakers from the Grizzly Corps.

1930's: Bert Pound '34 is once again in the University of Washington news. On April 10, Bert was honored as a Golden Graduate at the first-ever annual GG Brunch, to honor all UW grads from 50 or more years ago. Good grief – that means UW quarterback **Todd Hullin '61** (UW '66) is eligible. Meanwhile, Bert is still doing his one-arm pushups after the Huskies score in football, and marching with the Alumni Band, at age 99. Bert (UW '37) has a deep and lasting love affair with the university. He was awarded the inaugural Golden Graduates

Distinguished Alumnus Award, for a "lifetime of sustained engagement with the University." Congratulations, Bert.

1940's: George W. Jeffs '42 was honored by the UW ('45, '48) as one of the UW Wondrous One Hundred. He is a renowned engineer for the Apollo missions to the moon, and was part of the team working to save the crippled Apollo 13 after its near tragedy in space. The "missions" team won a Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1970. George joins

fellow Grizzlies **Bob Houbregs '49** and **Pete Chiarelli '76** on this UW list. Also on the list is political cartoonist David Horsey, son of Queen Anne Orchestra and Band Director **Raymond Horsey** (QA 1956-59). Classmates who knew **Peter Fleming '46**, who died in the jungles of Ecuador in 1956, are asked to contact **Glo Holcomb '46** (206-783-9036; gloholcomb@gmail.com). She is helping Pete's brother, **Ken '45**, and others with a new history of that event. **Anabel Newman '47** has been involved in education since graduation. In the 1980's she was one of the chairpersons for the National Coalition for Literacy. In the 1990's, she received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Indiana Humanities Council. All this occurred while she was a professor at Indiana University (Bloomington). She is involved in adult literacy programs which now includes an internet program called Little Abe (www.littleabe/about).

1950's: Virginia (Callison) Dolan-Ryno '50 is back on her travels, currently in Spain and its territories. **Terris "Terry" Howard '52** recently retired as 727 crew chief in charge of the restoration of the first 727 built by Boeing. Work was done at the Museum of Flight Restoration Center at Paine Field in Everett, WA. The final flight of the plane was to the Museum of Flight at Boeing Field on March 2, 2016.

QAHSAA 2016 SCHOLARSHIPS

Our 34th annual scholarship competition resulted in 30 scholarship awards made possible by the exceptional generosity of classes, reunion groups, individual donations and the collective donations of many Queen Anne alumni. There were 41 applications received by the March 31st deadline. From these, 17 scholarships were awarded to high school seniors and 13 to college students.

IMPORTANT NOTE: the 2017 competition will be limited to high school graduates, trade school applicants, and university undergraduate students only. See story page 1.

Those interested in competing for a 2017 award should download the NEW application from the QA website this fall and take great care to follow the completion instructions for the application form AND THE COVER LETTER.

There is no excuse for not complying with every requirement.

Do not use an obsolete application form.

Applicants must submit official transcripts, signed by/from their school's registrar, which must contain their fall semester grades.

Anything less than an official, signed transcript will disqualify the applicant from competition!

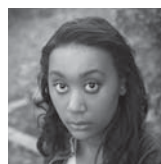

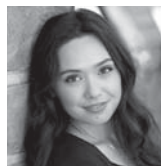
Jessica Strong – a previous winner, she begins her sophomore year majoring in nursing

He tried to encourage a smile by bantering with the serious Mr. Kato who, Gary observed, was very tolerant of their teenage student shenanigans in the back of the lab with "wash bottle fights". Gary hoped that Mr. Kato realized that the students were fond of him and had great respect for him, even though they mimicked his accent in their teenage insensitivity.

Gary's banter got no response one day in November, and then he noted that Mr. Kato was listening to

a transistor radio announcing the assassination of President Kennedy. Gary detected a tear running down Mr. Kato's cheek.

Gary received the highest score in his mid-term UW chemistry lecture class of 120. He stopped by QAHS on the day before Thanksgiving and went to Mr. Kato's class to let him know about the test. Gary told Mr. Kato that "it was as much a credit if not more to him than me." Mr. Kato was the best teacher Gary ever had. That was the last time Gary saw Mr. Kato.
