## What I Did Last Summer

My first ever trip to Washington D.C. last summer was to attend the ceremony at our elegant White House on July 18th for the presentation of the Medal Of Honor to my eighty-six year old uncle, Lt. Col Charles S. Kettles, United States Army (Ret.).

I was thrilled and grateful that he was finally honored (while he is still alive) for three perilous helicopter rescues he conducted as Flight Commander Major Kettles on 15 May 1967, near Duc Pho, Vietnam.

The first rescue involved leading six UH-1 (Huey) helicopters to carry reinforcements to an embattled force and to evacuate wounded personnel. Heavy damage was inflicted. He then volunteered to return to the battlefield with reinforcements and with full knowledge of continuing enemy fire awaiting his arrival. The enemy fire seriously wounded his gunner and severely damaged his helicopter, with fuel streaming from his aircraft. He returned for the

third time for an extraction of 40 remaining troops. Once airborne, he was informed that there were still eight troops unable to reach the rescue zone due to enemy fire. Without gunship, artillery or tactical aircraft support, he returned to the zone for the remaining eight. The enemy fire destroyed both windshields and the chin bubble. He returned all troops safely, later stating that "he did his job".

At the Hall of Heroes ceremony at the Pentagon on July 19th, he said he was grateful that none of those names he rescued are on the Vietnam Wall (which I had visited to sadly see my lost classmate's names). It was most humbling to see all the men and women in uniform during these events. I also had the privilege of sitting next to the gunner at a special dinner given at the Hay-Adams Hotel (which looks over to the White House). The gunner had come from Germany to Canada and upon finding out that Canada was not going to fight in Vietnam, he went to Windsor, Ontario and swam across the river to Detroit and somehow got into the Army. Another story!

And yes, the President did get to meet me. I thanked him and his family for their service to our great country.

Now in its 35th year of awarding scholarships, the Queen Anne High School Alumni Association reminds all grads that this year's **application deadline is March 31, 2017**. First, send good thoughts along with mine to **Henry Arnoux '61**, whose wife had a very bad tumble down steps last month, leaving her with a major head injury. She was at a care center for physical rehab, but is now back home.

**1930s:** We lost **Bert Pound '34** in November. Bert was born in Canada but was renowned for his snare drum playing and athletic feats in pushups for every score UW made in football for the last 72 years. Bert died shortly after celebrating his 100th birthday! **Dr. Glen Player '37**, whose activities were great while he had classmates to contact, came into our view as a result of a genealogy website (Dear MYRTLE) who happens to be his daughter. In an article dealing with archiving, she wrote: "Ol' Myrt is committed to pulling all of her father-dad's high school class reunion 'stuff' in preparation for sending to an archive in Seattle. I cannot help but think I should scan and blog about everything I encounter. That would also get the word out to descendants of Dad's classmates." Dr. Player died in 2008.

**1940s:** **Warren Gilfillan '41** wrote to us in July, stating that he is 94 years old, Army Air Corps Vet., BS in Wildlife Mgmt. from WSC, MS in Environmental Education (U. of Ore.), 10 years as professional Boy Scout Exec., 17 years as founder and dir. of Multnomah County Outdoor School program, retiring in 1983. He states he is a lifetime hunter, fisher, backpacker, wood carver, world

traveler and youth worker. He lives in Wilsonville, OR. **Dr. Art Stamey '46, D.D.S.**, died July 5, 2016. He was for many years a world traveler, often with his wife, Janice. He visited over 70 countries, hiking across many of them. He visited all seven continents, and sailed solo twice across the South Pacific. **Richard Steves '47** has engendered two generations of travel mavens. His son, Rick Steves, is well known to world travelers as both author and TV regular, but his grandson, Andy Steves, is also now the author of a new travel book to Europe.

They are members of Bethany Presbyterian on Queen Anne Hill. **Nancy (Olsen) Gradwohl '56** graduated from Pacific Lutheran Seminary in Aug. 2015 and

recently was ordained as a pastor in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Her six sons all participated in the ceremony. She now serves as pastor of Island of Faith Lutheran Church in Wrangell, Alaska. **Gerry Bradley '59** continues to work on writing and various radio talk shows. **Sid Noel '59** is still adjusting to 3 days of dialysis a week, and trying to keep up with classmates.

## Reese Malcolm Lindquist

Mar. 28, 1936—Oct. 2, 2016

Head football coach for the Queen Anne Grizzlies from 1966-1974, Reese brought the team to a strength

which earned them five division titles and three tries for the Seattle Metro City Title, only the last of which they won, in an upset victory over Nathan Hale, which had beaten them early in the season by 29-7. That was 1973, and the first time I actually saw a coach being carried off the field by his team! The 14-12 upset of Hale gave the Grizzlies their first city title since 1965, also a victory over Nathan Hale (7-6).

Reese grew up in Seattle, son of renowned football coach A.J. "Swede" Lindquist. Reese played for Garfield High, and was on the 1953 team whose only loss was to Queen Anne, which won the city title that year. Reese remembered playing

against a surprisingly strong group of Grizzlies, losing by a score of 23-14. Those 14 points were the most scored on Queen Anne that season. Reese's 1971 Grizzly team managed two huge wins, a 52-13 pounding of West Seattle, and a 42-12 romp over Garfield. His 1969 squad managed to hold city champion Ingraham to a mere 14-6 victory. Ingraham had been a three-touchdown favorite going into the game.

Reese graduated from Garfield in 1954 and UW in 1958. He played on Jim Owens' first UW team and served as starting center and linebacker. He was a Pacific Coast Conference all-star for the Huskies. He joined the U.S. Navy after graduation and ended his naval career as Commander. He married Cecile Evans in 1958, raising two sons, both of whom preceded Reese in death. Reese and Cecile attended many of the Queen Anne alumni luncheons. He and Cecile had celebrated their 58th wedding anniversary earlier in 2016.

Lindquist taught history and social studies when he wasn't coaching. His record as football coach is one of the best for Queen Anne: 49 wins, 27 losses and 2 ties.

## General Peter Chiarelli '68 Helping Mend Lives

**General Peter Chiarelli '68**, U.S. Army Retired, leads One Mind, a nonprofit dedicated to expediting research and discovering better diagnoses for brain-injured soldiers and civilians.

His passion for those suffering from traumatic brain injuries and post-traumatic stress drove him, during his 40-year military career and into his retirement, to work to change military culture to acknowledge the validity of their wounds.

Last summer the UW presented Gen. Chiarelli (UW '80) with the 2016 Distinguished Alumni Veteran Award for his service to the country and lifelong compassionate commitment to soldiers.

Gen. Chiarelli grew up in Magnolia, the son of a meat cutter. He attended Queen Anne, where he played on the Golf Team and worked on The KUAY, graduating from Seattle University in 1972.

He did two combat tours of Iraq with two tours as commander-in-charge of day-to-day operations in Iraq. He also served as Vice Chief of Staff of the U.S. Army for four years and is the highest-ranking UW alumnus Army officer to have served in Iraq. As Vice Chief of Staff, Chiarelli had responsibility for overseeing medical services. In his four years in that job, he visited every U.S. Army hospital, encountering high rates of traumatic-brain injuries and post-traumatic stress. He saw the pain of those who returned home "with profound but invisible wounds of war." Chiarelli says these conditions present themselves in many ways—suicide, broken relationships and marriages, addictions and homelessness.

Gen. Chiarelli proudly came to Meany Hall in 2012 to present the Congressional Gold Medal to 82 Nisei veterans who served during WWII, though many of their families were sent to internment camps. He said, "I have never been so honored in my life".

We are honored that he is a QAHS alum. Thank you, Gen. Peter Chiarelli.

**New policies** for selecting recipients are now in place for 2017 applicants. These **changes** are as follows:

1. You can only win once. No repeat winners.
2. Available only for college undergrad or trade & vocational studies. Not available for post-graduate studies.
3. Applicants must be:
  - a. High school senior;
  - b. GED or equivalent grad;
  - c. College undergrad; or
  - d. Former students seeking post-high school education.
