M.V. KALAKALA (1935-1967) – Shaken But Not Forgotten

Seattle has many noted architectural structures on land. The M.V. Kalakala (Chinook for "flying bird") was its most noted memorable structure "on sea". The wonder ferry was voted the second most favorite tourist attraction after the Space Needle during the 1962 Seattle World's Fair. Fortunately, we still have the Space Needle.

Purchased in 1933 as the burned hull of the Peralta (Oakland to San Francisco ferry) by the Puget Sound Navigation Company (Black Ball Line), it was towed to Kirkland (then Houghton) to be transformed into stunning art deco redesign. The Naval Architect was Helmuth Schmidt, QAHS 1910 graduate.

The new bridge and wheelhouse were built out of copper, with a 3000- diesel horsepower engine to reach 18 knots making it the largest and fastest ferry on Puget Sound with 2000 passengers. There were many luxurious features, also. There were velvet covered chairs, ladies lounge, full galley, sun deck, bar and showers for the shipyard workers since the ferry was the Seattle-Bremerton run. With extended runs during WWII, this also made it a tourist attraction with evening cruises especially with the Flying Birds dance orchestra.

There was another well remembered "feature"-the vibration. A heavy vibration was due to poor alignment of the engine during the rebuild. It was corrected by 40% in 1956 when the propeller was replaced.

Fellow classmate Paul Christensen was fortunate to have been part of the crew for two summers on the Kalakala:

"My duties on the Kalakala had changed. I was now experienced from one year of summer work. I now worked on the deck and had opportunities to steer the boat under the direction of the Captain or First Officer. It was a small wheelhouse, almost dome shaped, and all copper with porthole windows. While underway, the boat did shake quite a

bit. I am told that they had repaired the boat since WWII to take most of the shake away. I worked the boat the following summer and was on the Kalakala for its last official scheduled trip."

Cars became larger after the war reducing the Kalakala's capacity by 40%. It was auctioned off and relocated to Alaska for fish processing eventually being grounded in Kodiak. Efforts to restore the ferry failed. The Kalakala was purchased by the Kalakala

Foundation and floated back to Seattle in 1998 to be restored only to be moored and later evicted from Lake Union as an eyesore and sent to Neah Bay, then Tacoma. Eventually parts were sold off. Some were purchased by the City of Kirkland and the wheelhouse can be found facing Puget Sound and the Seattle skyline at Salty's on Alki. So fortunately we DO have a bit of the much loved shaker "Silver Slug" (one of its nicknames).



Grizzly Goodbye Salute

At a memorial service on November 12th, we said goodbye to fellow board member James A. Le Penske Jr. (May 24, 1944 - Oct. 15, 2022), class of 1962. James was a Queen Anne Alumni Association board member since 2016 and a donor since 2009.

We enjoyed James' wit, wisdom, generosity and participation. Along with his brother-in-law, he transported Al's grill to our annual Alumni picnics.

His family's story of having to give up their home for the building of Catherine Blaine Junior High School is in the" Magnolia Midcentury Memories" book.

Along with James being of service to our school, he was of service to our country. In 1966 Jim enlisted in the United States Army attending flight school when he was stationed in Arkansas as a warrant officer. As a member of the 92nd assault helicopter company Stallions, James went to Viet Nam on numerous tours, flying Hueys for medical evacuations as well as Blackhawks and Chinooks. He was then stationed in Kentucky and Seattle. At his last station in 1983 in Heidelberg James served as Deputy Chief of Staff Operations manager providing planning, time

phasing and prioritization of aviation force deployment requirements. He proudly retired in 1992 as Lt. Colonel returning to Seattle.

The following is an excerpt from letter on display with many mementos of James extraordinary life at his memorial:

"What the Code of an Officer Means to Me by James LePenske

As an officer in the United States Army, I feel it my duty to serve my country and to uphold the Constitution of the United States. In this modern world of atomic power. campus riots, jungle warfare and political unrest, I feel it an even more important job. We are at war at home, just as much as in Vietnam. Our war at home is one against racism, poverty and lack of patriotism. As officers, we must face each problem with confidence that what we are doing is moral and right. We must feel our leadership is for the good of all the people. As officers, we must face each problem with confidence that what we are doing is moral and right. As officers we represent the United States on foreign soil or in a small section of our country."

In this passage he is still serving our country well in so many capacities.

On a personal note, James was a member of the Vietnam Helicopters Association along with my uncle Lt.Col. Charles S. Kettles, 2016 MOH recipient for three treacherous helicopter rescues in one day, May 15, 1967 in Viet Nam. James met my uncle at a VHA event a few years ago in Puyallup. He thoughtfully and generously gave me his copy of their magazine with my uncle featured on the front cover (which my uncle modestly had not told me about!).

We are honored to have had James as a fellow Grizzly.


1940s

helped Sally get her mom inside to see the chalkboard. The following day Debbie, Ardelle's daughter and Tim Meissner, Reidun's son were able to meet with Seattle Schools, the architect and contractors to also see this historical sight.

Seattle Schools plans to preserve the chalkboard; they will be putting a glass window in the wall so people can view it, as it is too fragile to relocate.

The ladies had visited their old alma mater back in 2014 prior to the renovation and met with the principal there.




