


# Co-President's Message

### **Mascot Origin**

Reprint from John Hennes article 1991

### Class of '31 set major traditions.

At 21, Queen Anne finally chose its mascot.

Not many classes at Queen Anne have left such a durable mark on our school as did the Class of 1931, 60 years ago. They gave us two lasting traditions by adopting our school mascot name of "Grizzlies" and by choosing to be the first class to wear caps and gowns at commencement.

The KUAY Weekly of November 5, 1930, records the historical selection by student vote of the school mascot name Grizzlies. Prior to that time, the QA sports teams were referred to in the press as the Kuays, the Hilltoppers, or just the Queen Anne team. From a preliminary vote on a large list of suggested name submittals, including such interesting ideas as silver marmots and caribous, the three highest were chosen for a final vote in students' homerooms. Grizzlies, Cougars, and Pirates were voted on. It was no

## **Photographer** Extraordinaire

Grant Haller '63 was born in London, UK, to a soldier father and a British mother on December 2, 1944. The Hallers moved to Seattle Washington after the war and settled on Queen Anne Hill. Grant's father's family had a tradition of commercial fishing in Port Angeles, so Grant's father continued that at Fishermen's Terminal while Grant and siblings attended school on Queen Anne.

Grant had an interest in photography even in high school, and after attending Everett Community College, served two years in the Army, he went to the University of Washington and worked as a freelance journalist and photographer for The Daily, the U of W college newspaper. With a degree in Communications, he next worked for the Everett Herald, the Seattle Times, and eventually the Seattle Post Intelligencer for 33 years.

In the 1970s he took photos of Vietnam War protests, the Sky River

Rock Festival. Seattle Liberation Front demonstrations, the Satsop River Fair and Tin Cup Races, the People's Coalition for Peace and Justice marches, anti-McGovern protestors at Boeing Field, the Crabshell Alliance protests, marchers protesting infringements on Native fishing rights, to mention a few. All the important events of the day capturing life in the Pacific Northwest.

One of his big stories was May 18, 1980 when he learned Mt. St. Helens was erupting. He drove to Boeing Field and contacted a pilot he knew there. This pilot liked flying PI reporters because he said, "They weren't afraid to die." Together they flew near the mountain getting close-up photographs, so close that the engine sputtered through the ash plume. They had turned off the transponder so as to not get in trouble with the FAA. The pilot was later fined \$10,000 for flying too close to an erupting volcano, but Grant got some stellar photos that day. The PI closed March 17, 2009, but he stayed on to the very end.

In retirement he continued to enjoy the out-of-doors and his grandkids. July 26, 2017 he died fighting a heart illness and interstitial lung disease leaving behind a huge collection of photographs, 40 file cabinets full, which the family decided should go to the University of Washington's Special Collections department.

contest, however, as the Grizzlies won with 70 percent of the vote and the other two names each with 15 percent.

It is interesting to note that the "Grizzly Inn" preceded this choice of school mascot name by at least four years, leading to the conclusion that we are named after a hamburger joint. A good thing there was no McDonald's. As to why the Grizzly Inn had its name? The general mythology is that a bear was seen on the slopes of Queen Anne Hill in the early years of the twentieth century and that George Lamoreux, '24, who bought the Inn in 1926, pushed for the name and the mascot as well. Prior to Lamoreux the Inn, located at 214 Galer St., had been called "Louie's Place."
