skills to provide technical support to the series of volunteers updating the alumni membership database. When it became necessary to upgrade from DOS to Windows in 2000, L D created the current membership database system that supports KUAY mailings, event registration, Grizzly Angels and deceased records for the KUAY and several other functions. The big changes in involvement came in 2007 with the retirement of long-time Board members Hal Will '44 and Francis (Chapman) Harris 35. L D took over membership management from Hal, and Jackie was elected to the Board as Corresponding Secretary replacing Francis. In addition, L D and Jackie reorganized logo merchandise management, started an inventory control and ordering system using QuickBooks still used today and created a process for building and maintaining kits of Grizzly Gear to sell at reunions and events.

Don Thompson '57 created and maintained the QAHSAA website starting in the early 2000's, and L D began supporting Don with content to be posted. Later, after Don left the area, L D became more involved enhancing the Class Directory Pages and posting deceased and missing lists by class, updating the Reunions page and developing the Logo merchandise page so alums



Eugene "Gene" (Huisman) Butler ('65) was born in Macon, Georgia, but he and his mother moved to Seattle and Queen Anne High School where he found himself taking Drama classes from Mr. Jay Paulette. Mr. Paulette inspired many students including Gene to become an actor.

He remembered a funny, embarrassing incident when he was a freshman at Queen Anne and playing the role of a praying priest in the King and I staring Bill Mueller and Helen Faber, 1963. He had a mild wardrobe malfunction that still makes him turn red and then laugh. He eventually made his way to Los Angeles and there he became a fullfledged actor with staring roles in TV, film and on stage. Some TV series he acted in were: Dynasty 1989 2 episodes, Believe in Eve 1991, Hunter 1989, Walker, Texas Ranger 1995, Matlock 1990, McGyver, Charlie's Angels, Beverly Hills Cop II and a long list of others.

He was nominated in 1977 for the Joseph Jefferson Award for an Actor in a Principal Role for his performance in P.S. Your Cat is Dead at the Pheasant Run Theatre in Chicago, Illinois. He did some writing, directing and producing of two evenings of one-act plays at the

Pickleball, a Popular New Sport

Joel Pritchard, born May 5, 1925, graduated from Queen Anne High School in 1944. When he graduated, did his classmates realize he would become a remarkable politician and inventor? Most are not around to ask.

Joel served two years in the Army, attended Marietta College far from home in Ohio for one year, and returned to Seattle to work for Griffin Envelope Company where he soon became president of the company.

While working at the envelope company, he went to the Republican National Convention in 1958 where they nominated Dwight D Eisenhower for president. He then ran for and served in the Washington House of Representatives from 1959 to 1967. Next, he was elected to the Washington State Senate (36th District) for one term.

In 1972 he ran for the US House of Representatives a second time, and this time he won. He was then easily reelected and served there until 1985. He next sought the position of Lieutenant Governor of Washington and was elected in 1988 and served until 1997, two terms.

In about 1965 he owned a summer home on Bainbridge Island where he and his family would spend the summers. But you know how kids moan and complain that they are bored? His kids were super bored with swimming in the Sound, walking the beach, biking around the island and playing in the sun. Poor kids. Joel joined together with two island friends, Bill Bell and Magnolia resident Barney McCallum (McCallum/Seattle Envelope). There was a badminton court available where they lowered the net. In the garage using some spare plywood, they constructed some paddles like large pingpong paddles and using a Nerf ball, they created a game combining tennis with ping-pong that they soon called Pickleball, named after the Pritchard's dog, Pickle, who chased after the Nerf ball.

That was 1965. It has taken some time, but by 2020 Pickleball has become the fastest growing sport in the United States. The reason for its popularity is that learning the game is quick, so now it is growing outside of the United States.

So, a fun new sport came from a Queen Anne graduate, politician and his summer friends.

Fast Food Haunts

Dags hamburgers with the Beefy Boy logo, a 19-cent burger joint, for years was the Queen Anne High School fast food hangout, and if you had a car, or a friend with one, you could be "seen" at Dags on Aurora. Queen Anne students undoubtedly keep them in business.

That location was originally a stonecutter who sold monuments with epitaphs. It was owned and run by the Messet family, but when the elder died, Ed and Bo Messet developed a fast food restaurant on the site. This was in 1959.

The Messets used strange and screwball promotions, like a credit card that said it was good only when accompanied by cash. According to Paul Dorpat (Seattle Times), its reader board sported many humorous sayings. In 1962 when "Century 21, Worlds Fair" took off, according to John Redden, a Seattle Times humorist, they served 400 steers a year and four tons of French fried potatoes each week.

On the other hand, if you were a Ballard High student, the place to go was just across the street at Zesto's. It started ahead of Dags in 1948, run and developed by the Pattok family from Grand Rapids, MI. At the time Zesto's was a national franchise that had developed the first continuousfeed ice-cream dispenser. Later the franchise disbanded and its restaurants were on their own.

It sported a neon soft-serve icecream cone, eventually a '57 Chevy Bel Air on the roof and red vinyl booths. Zesto's was known for large food portions. If you were a Ballard High student, that's where you could be seen.

Zesto's closed in 2012, replaced by RoRoBBQ, and later El Camion Mexican restaurant. In August 2021 the restaurant burned, and it will soon be home to a six-story, 74 unit mixed-use building.





"The Boys in The Boat" Helped by QAHS Grad

The recently released movie, "The Boy's in the Boat," dramatizes the University of Washington eight-oared crew that stunned Adolf Hitler after recovering from a chaotic start to win the gold medal at the 1936 Olympic Games.

James "Jim" B McMillin, the tallest member of that Husky crew, was a QAHS graduate from the class of 1933.

McMillin, who became a rowing coach at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, worked as a Boeing Co. engineer and lived his last 47 years on Bainbridge Island. He died on Aug 22, 2005 in Bremerton, but his legacy continues today.
